It has very good mechanical properties and chemical resistance. To be used as topcoat in atmospheric environments. The product is fully recoatable at any stage of curing. It cures down to 0 °C. The product does not contain isocyanates, neither does it generate di-isocyanates during hotwork / welding or fire.
